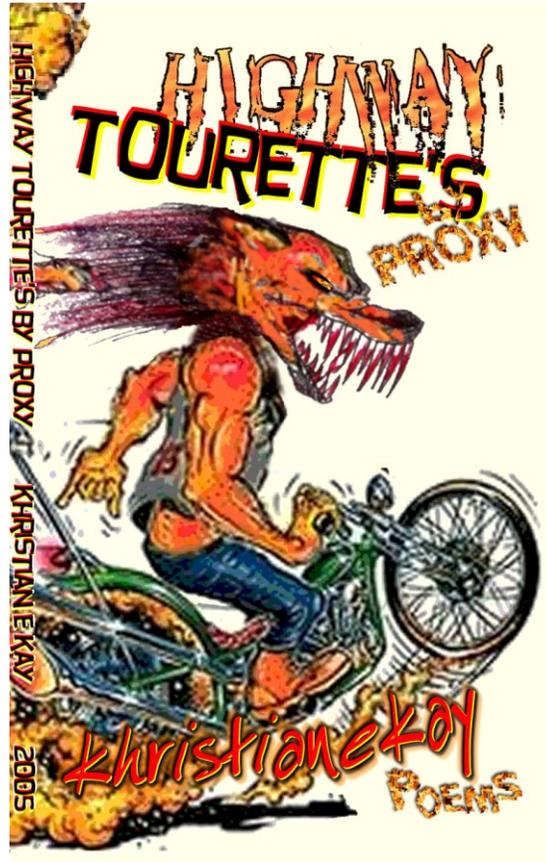

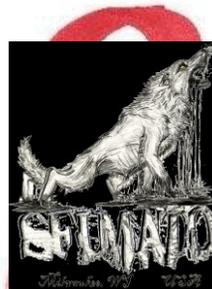

ABOUT THIS BOOK

"Highway Tourette's by Proxy" is the latest collection of poems by controversial writer Khristian E. Kay. These words often reflect criticisms on cultural mores, established idioms, political intrigue, and always the *status quo*. Oftentimes biting, and humorous, these poems take a wry view of what it means to "grow up" in America. These poems are a rhythmic metaphor for a *perceptualized* Americana which takes the reader on a no holds-barred thrill ride: wind in the hair, bugs in the teeth and only enough money to get across a spiritual state line. Perhaps most evident of this is the closing stanza from *Caricatura*:

*I am the wolf at your doorstep
and I am howling beneath your porch
I could put you into the words
and make you deliberate:
if what you see is what you like*

-- I could

*I am the storyteller
and place you upon my knee*

What does "KnowB4No" mean?

KnowB4No.org is a non-profit organization designed to educate our population on the hazards and the ease of which HIV and related diseases have taken an epidemic control over our society. "Knowledge before Abstinence" does not promote promiscuity – instead it stands that we need to educate people about the hazards and transmission of blood borne pathogens and communicable diseases.

What does this mean to us?
